All artists need room to breathe, time to think and experiment. Iniqarvik provides Inuit creatives from all disciplines the financial support to research, experiment, begin or complete new works, or plan future creations. Small scale proposals from all disciplines will be accepted for grants of \$3,500 or \$5,000.





Eligibility

- · Must be Inuk and living in Canada with citizenship, permanent residence or refugee status;
- · Be at least 18 years old;
- Have specialized training in their artistic discipline (academic accreditation not a requirement);
- Recognized as an artist by their peers (i.e. artists working in the same artistic tradition) for a minimum of 2-3 years;
- · Are committed to continually furthering their artistic practice.

- Audio (maximum 10 minutes of content)
 - » Please include the specific time marks you would like assessors to review for each video in the Artistic Examples
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- Written (maximum 5 pages)
 - » Can be one complete work or excerpts from multiple works.

- The number that matches to the example in the Artistic Examples List
- Your name

Quality of Images: Please be mindful of the quality of images you submit. Images should be clear, detailed, and show the quality of your work. For more tips about documenting your artwork, please refer to this Helpful Hints document and watch this workshop on Photographing Your Artwork.
